In July 2012 the Boerne City Council approved the Parks Master Plan for 2012-2022. Included in the document was an action plan that, based on citizen, staff, and council input, listed and prioritized recommendations for parks capital projects over the next ten years. The renovation to Veterans Plaza was identified as a top priority project.

A committee was formed and the suggestions from this group along with comments taken during the Parks Master Plan public input process were by staff to develop the Veterans Plaza master plan. Some items of note were to provide ADA access to the park, restore the deteriorating monument, create an inviting and usable space including shade, seating and restrooms, and to increase the aesthetics of the Main Street frontage. In 2014 City of Boerne City Council approved \$374,000 to be budgeted for renovations to Veterans Plaza.





The History of Veterans Plaza

Many Kendall County residents have answered the call to duty to serve their country in time of war. In 1923 the H. J. Graham family erected a Memorial Monument near the center of Military Plaza, (later named Veterans Plaza), honoring all the men and women who died as a result of military action in World War I. Additional names have been added to indicate those who lost their lives in World War II and the Korean War. As a result of the Vietnam War, citizens added a bronze piece to the top of the monument recognizing veterans of both World Wars,

Korean and Vietnam wars.
